

## Example Results Section

The mean was used to calculate the central tendency of the aggressiveness rating for each group because it is less impacted by outliers and more appropriate for small sample sizes. The range was also calculated to measure the dispersion because there were not any major outliers within this data set but does show the variety within the ratings.

The results show that participants who perceived the baby's gender as a male rated the aggressiveness level as a 7.8 on average and had a range of 4. Those who perceived the baby to be a girl ranked the aggressiveness as a 7.2 on average with a range of 2. Finally, those in the control group ranked the baby's aggressiveness as 7.4 with a range of 3.
